- Coordinating A forum for youth, providers, educators, and employers who share ideas, identify gaps, and provide solutions
- 3. Strategizing Establish regional strategies that prioritize spending to serve the broadest youth population

- Initial one-year term that can be extended
- 12 20 members initially providers, educators, youth, employers
- Individuals who are youth-engaged volunteers year engagement
- 4 6 meetings in the initial year
- w2f participants
- Initial goals aligning providers to identify service gaps and propose solutions

- Provide a year-end summary of findings
- Use the findings to help draft a regional youth strategy
